

## WHAT IS SINUSITIS?



Chronic sinusitis: Chronic sinusitis can be caused by an infection, growths in the sinuses (nasal polyps) or by a deviated septum. Signs and symptoms may include nasal obstruction or congestion that causes difficulty breathing through your nose, and pain and swelling around your eyes, cheeks, nose or forehead.

## COMMON CAUSES OF CHRONIC SINUSITIS INCLUDE:

- Nasal polyps. These tissue growths can block the nasal passages or sinuses.
- Deviated nasal septum. A crooked septum — the wall between the nostrils — may restrict or block sinus passages.
- Other medical conditions. ...
- Respiratory tract infections. ...
- Allergies such as hay fever.

## COMMON SYMPTOMS OF SINUS INFECTION INCLUDE:

- Postnasal drip.
- Discolored nasal discharge (greenish in color)
- Nasal stuffiness or congestion.
- Tenderness of the face (particularly under the eyes or at the bridge of the nose)
- Frontal headaches.
- Pain in the teeth.
- Coughing.
- Fever.
