

WHAT IS HEAVY BLEEDING IN MENSTRUAL PERIOD?

Menorrhagia is the medical term for menstrual periods with abnormally heavy or prolonged bleeding. Although heavy menstrual bleeding is a common concern, most women don't experience blood loss severe enough to be defined as menorrhagia.

TYPES OF HEAVY BLEEDING IN MENSTRUAL PERIODS

The most common conditions include: Polyps, or growths in the uterine lining, usually cause spotting or bleeding between periods and sometimes HMB. Adenomyosis, the abnormal growth of uterine lining (endometrium) into the muscular wall of uterus, but can sometimes cause heavy and/or painful periods.

CAUSES OF HEAVY BLEEDING IN MENSTRUAL PERIODS

Small, benign growths on the lining of the uterus (uterine polyps) may cause heavy or prolonged menstrual bleeding. Adenomyosis. This condition occurs when glands from the endometrium become embedded in the uterine muscle, often causing heavy bleeding and painful periods.

SYMPTOMS OF HEAVY BLEEDING IN MENSTRUAL PERIODS

Uterine fibroids may cause heavier than normal or prolonged menstrual bleeding. Polyps, Small, benign growths on the lining of the uterus (uterine polyps) may cause heavy or prolonged menstrual bleeding. Adenomyosis.
