WHAT IS MUMPS

Mumps is a contagious disease caused by a virus that passes from one person to another through saliva, nasal secretions, and close personal contact. The condition primarily affects the salivary glands, also called the parotid glands. These glands are responsible for producing saliva.

CAUSES OF MUMPS

Mumps is due to an infection by the mumps virus. It can be transmitted by respiratory secretions (e.g. saliva) from a person already affected with the condition. When contracting mumps, the virus travels from the respiratory tract to the salivary glands and reproduces, causing the glands to swell.

SYMPTOMS OF MUMPS

- Pain in the swollen salivary glands on one or both sides of your face.
- Pain while chewing or swallowing.
- Fever.
- Headache.
- Muscle aches.
- Weakness and fatigue.
- Loss of appetite.
