

WHAT IS BELL'S PALSY?

Paralysis of the facial nerve causing muscular weakness in one side of the face.

REASONS FOR BELL'S PALSY

Although the exact reason Bell's palsy occurs isn't clear, it's often related to exposure to a viral infection. Viruses that have been linked to Bell's palsy include the virus that causes: Cold sores and genital herpes (herpes simplex) Chickenpox and shingles (herpes zoster)

SYMPTOMS FOR BELL'S PALSY

- Drooling
- Difficulty eating and drinking
- An inability to make facial expressions, such as smiling or frowning
- Facial weakness
- Muscle twitches in the face
- Dry eye and mouth
- Headache
- Sensitivity to sound
- Irritation of the eye on the involved side
